Mike Ottink – Analytic Overlay – EN

In his projects Mike Ottink playfully examines sensory perception and experience. The alchemy of noise and the desire to find something universal and tangible within it. Mike's drawings are merely evolved out of making graphic scores related to VHSUHF* noise outings

His current paintings have evolved out of drawn graphic scores. Autonomous pictures cite 'volatile' installations or performances of sound and moving images. They are an alternative to a sound, photo, or video recording, which in his view, corrupt the moment of execution. These works resonate the ideas of David Bohm on 'Quantum coherence': 'The fabric of reality is a holistic medium where everything coexists with everything else'. The so-called 'Implicate Order'.

In tune with ideas of stretching perceptual borders, Mike Ottink designs and builds his own drawing and painting tools. Through collaborations such as Amsterdam's VHSUHF he also creates musical instruments and techniques in the context of audio-visual performance. In an effort to evoke, experience, and express the invisible, as well as the inaudible, his works stand as the intuitive science: the alchemy of noise and the desire to find something universal and tangible within.

Mike Ottink works and lives in Amsterdam.

The opening will be accompanied by a live sound performance by VHSUHF*. [VHSUHF](#) is an ongoing collaboration between Mike Ottink and Brian McKenna (NL/CAN)

*VHSUHF, based in Amsterdam, have been operating since 2004. Their freeform improvised music relies upon the construction, combination, and interpretation of non-standard musical-instruments. Through the generation and manipulation of inherently unstable systems, their nuanced approach to electromechanical tuning seeks to identify and explode moments of resonant serendipity within the materials and their particular situation. Their simultaneous and mutually exclusive quests – to find the beauty in the noise, and to find the noise in the beauty – occasionally cancel each other out enough to invoke a space of serene tranquility. But most of the time, it's all about the process.

Mike Ottink – Analytic Overlay – NL

Mike Ottink onderzoekt in zijn projecten spelenderwijs zintuiglijke waarneming en beleving. De alchemie van noise / ruis en het verlangen daar iets universeels en tastbaars in te vinden.

Mikes tekeningen en schilderijen zijn initieel ontstaan als grafische partituren voortvloeiend uit zijn VHSUHF experimenten. Op dit moment richt hij zich op chaos / informatie als op zichzelf staand fenomeen.

Zijn werk resoneert met de ideeën van David Bohm over *Quantum coherence*: 'We leven in een holistisch medium waarin alles met elkaar co-existeert. De zogenaamde *Implicate order*'. Om de grenzen van de perceptie op te rekken, maakt hij zijn eigen teken- en schilder gereedschap. Ook bouwt hij in samenwerking met Brian McKenna zelf ontwikkelde instrumenten voor audiovisuele performances en installaties (VHSUHF). Zo vindt hij vorm om vervoering beleefbaar te maken en het onzichtbare of onhoorbare uit te drukken.

Mike Ottink woont en werkt in Amsterdam.

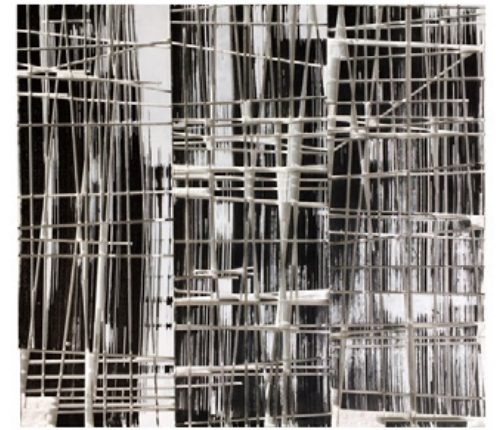

Mike Ottink – Installation for sound performance

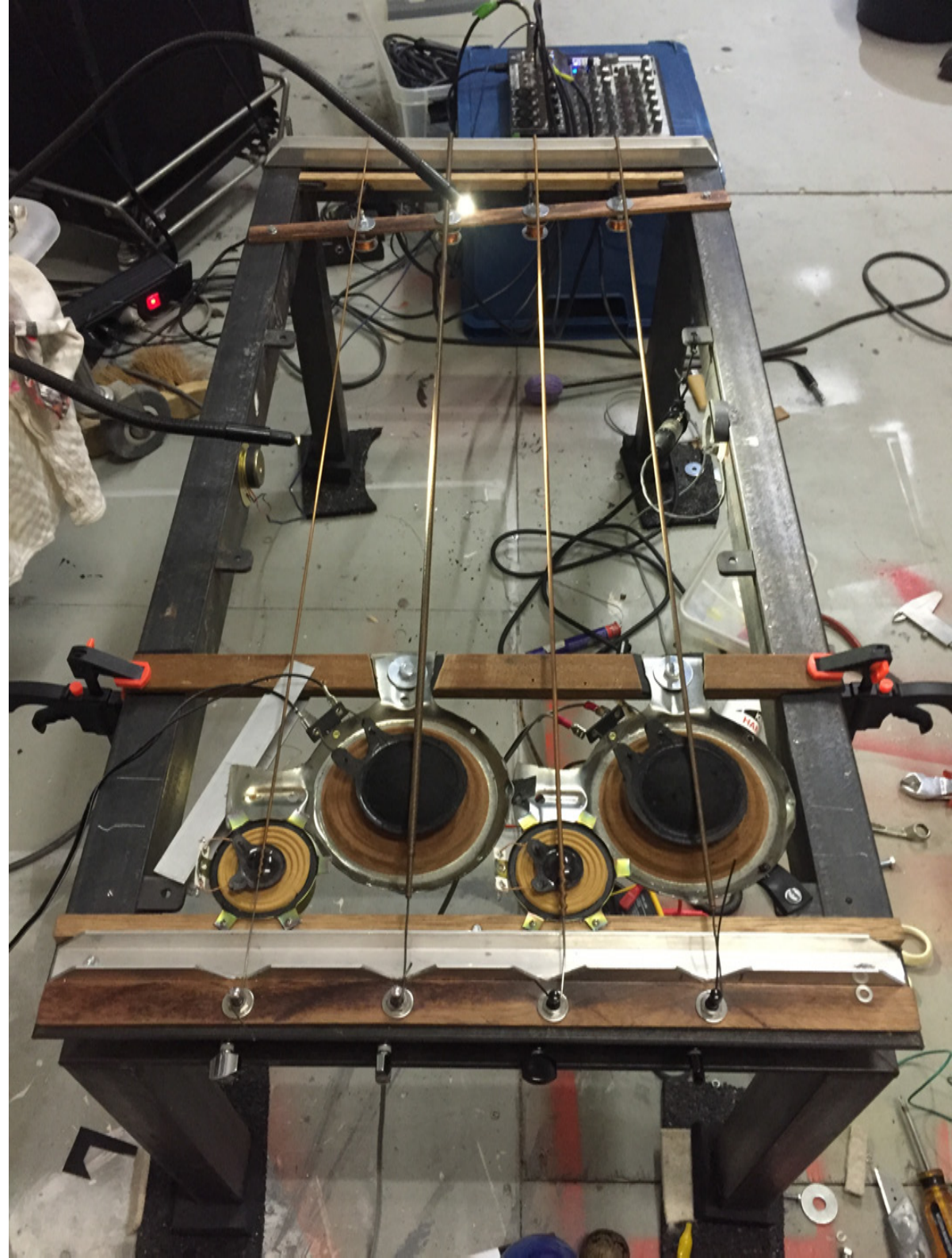
'Routinely Risking Destruction for the Sake of Narrow Gains' began as a site-specific work which used piano-string, oscillators, and specially adapted transducers to convert a subterranean object made from structural steel into large resonant crane/instrument. Through spectral analysis, the resonant audio frequencies of the steel were charted in order to harmonically tune the strings and oscillators. Once tuned, the structure would essentially 'play itself' from long-form self-generating compositions based on constructive and destructive interference. Subsequent to the initial experimentation and exhibition of the work, a portable version of the piece was build. This version has been used for a number of concerts, architectural interventions, and further experimentations.

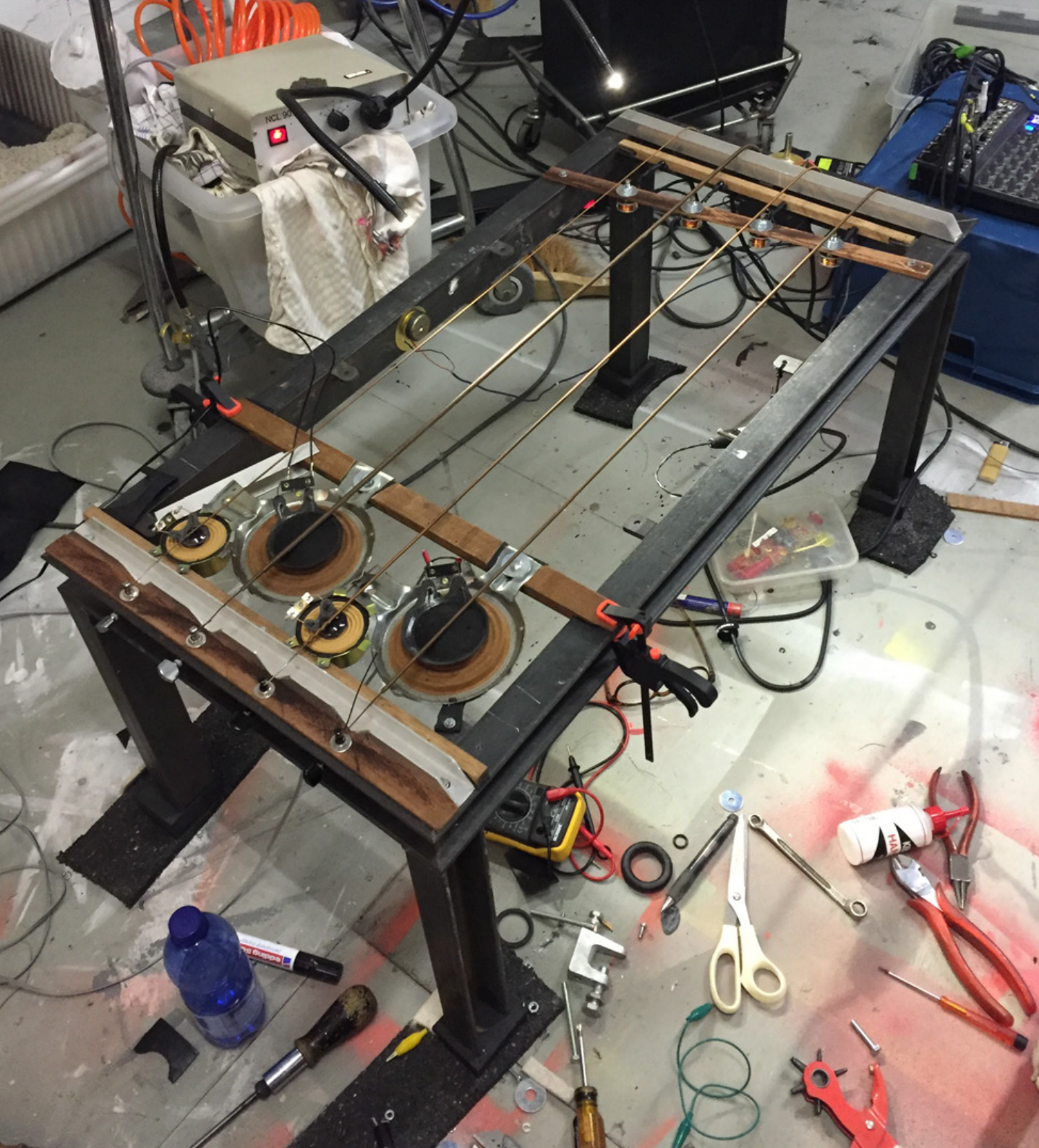

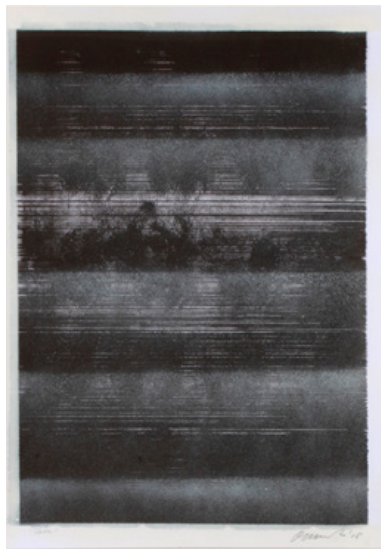

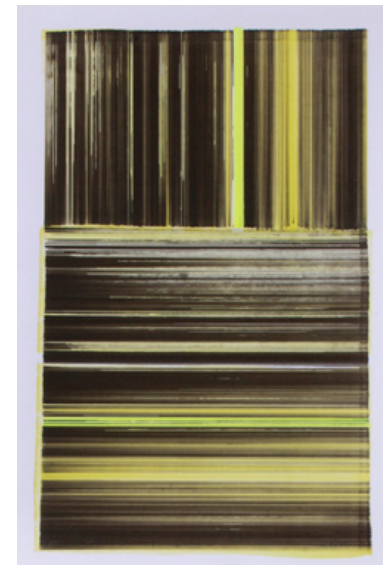

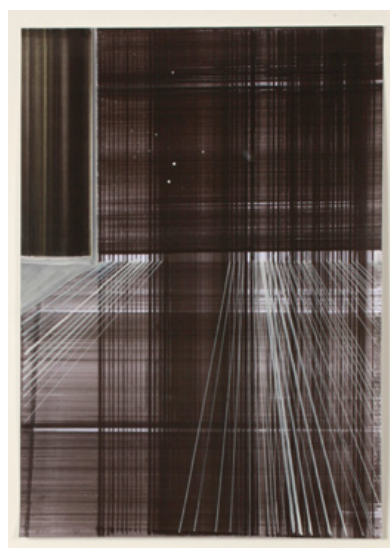

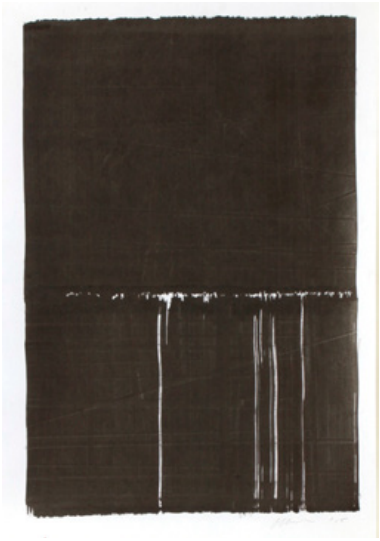

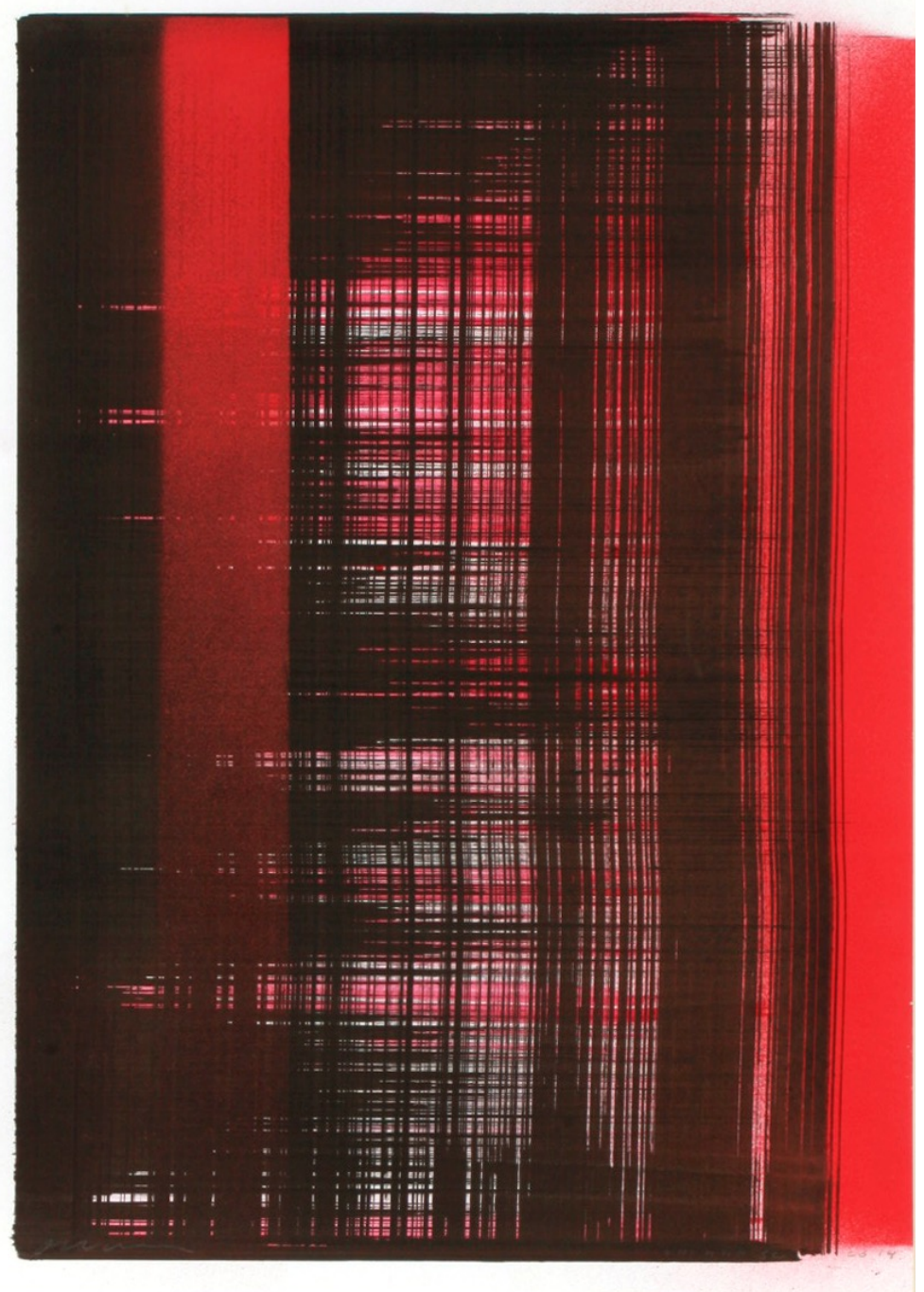

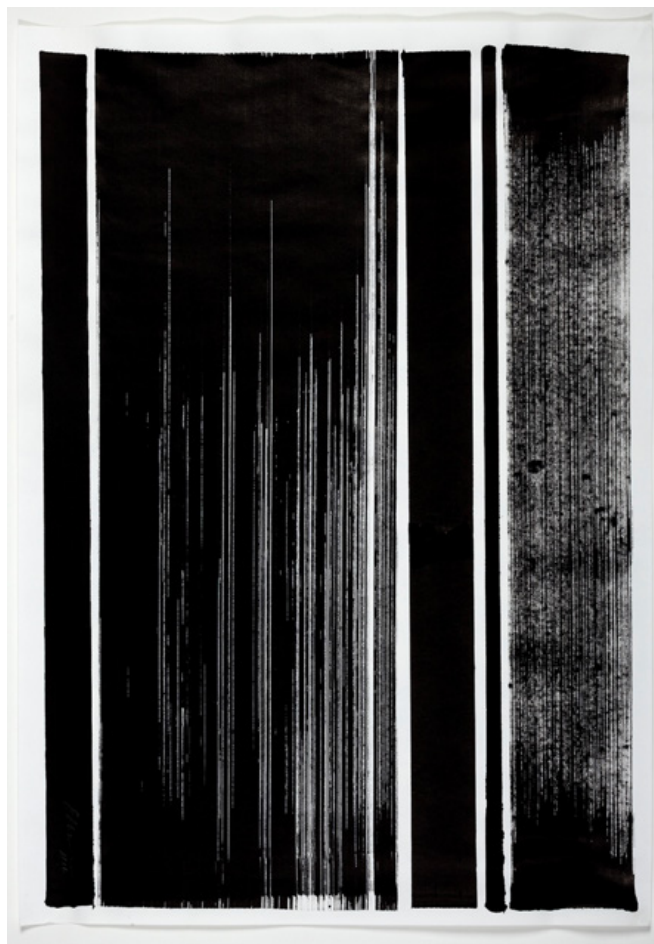

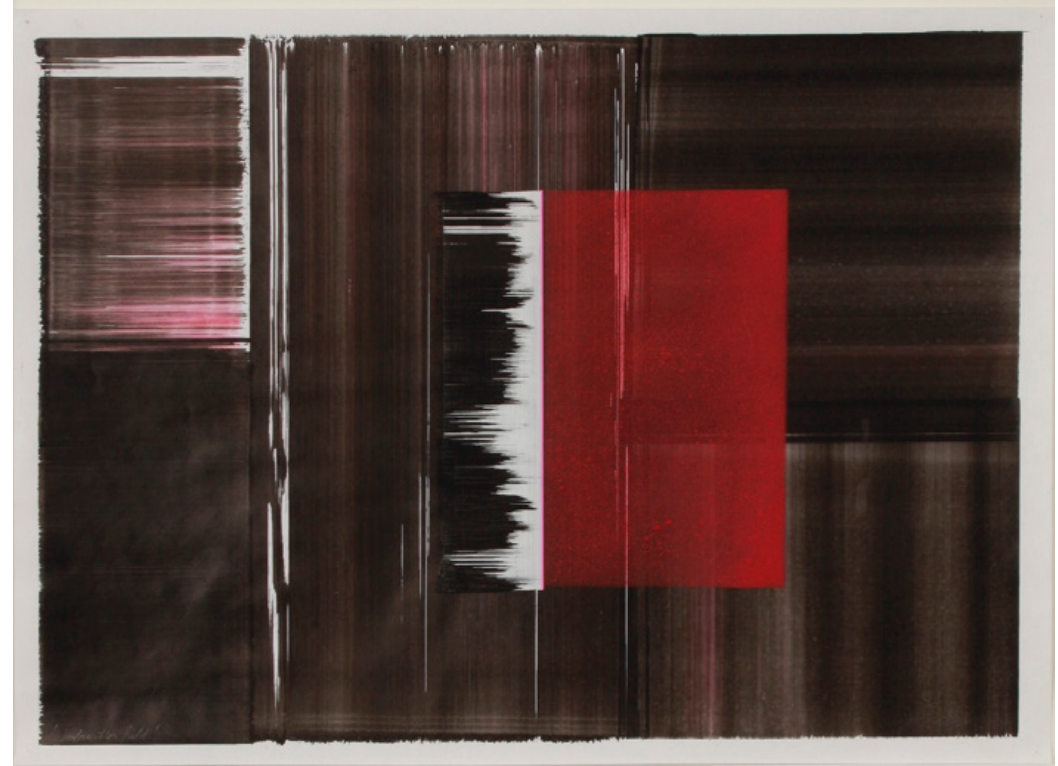

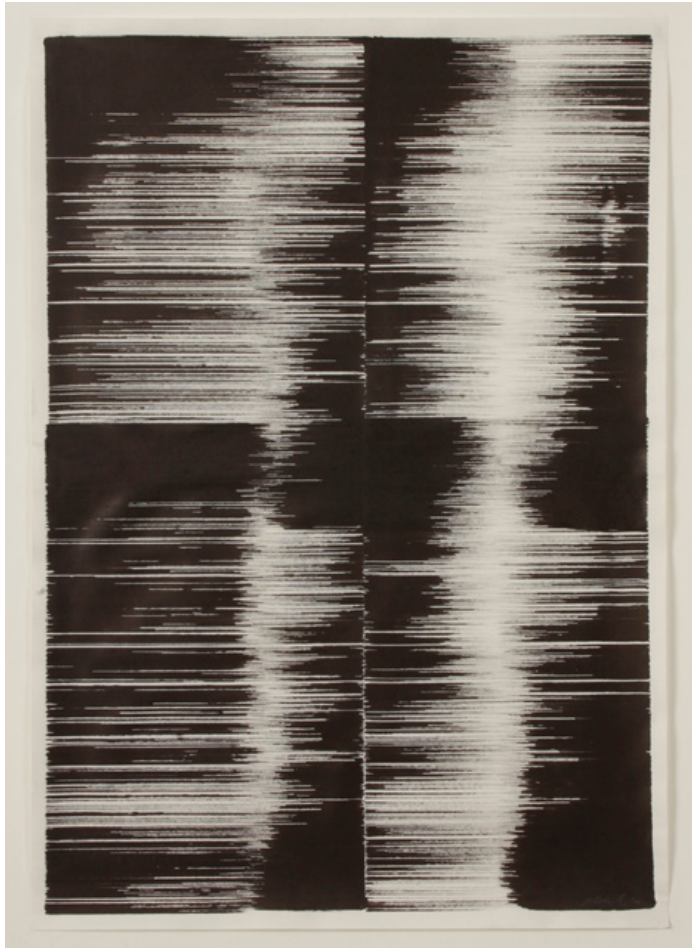

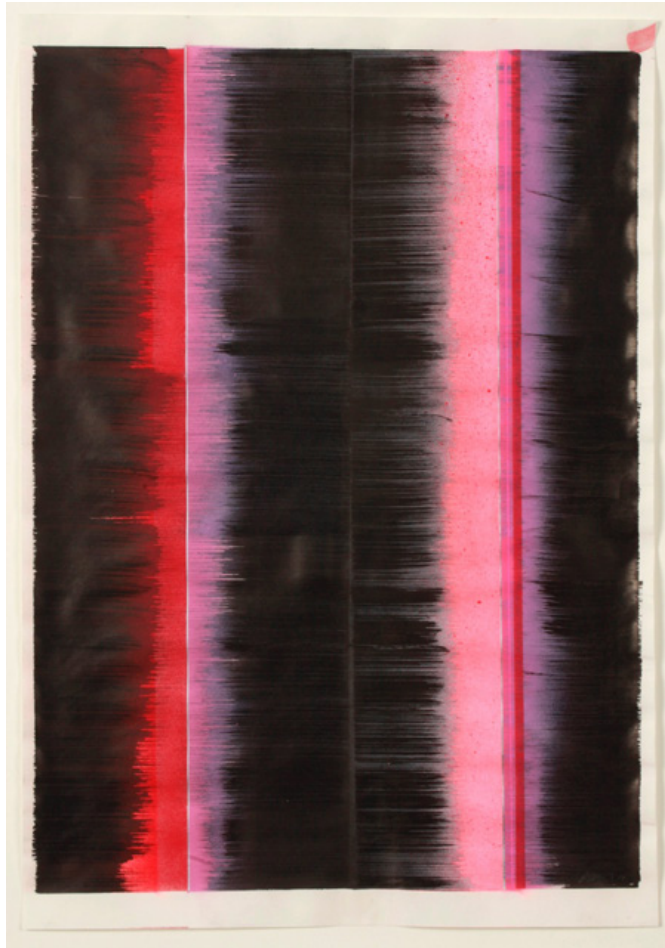

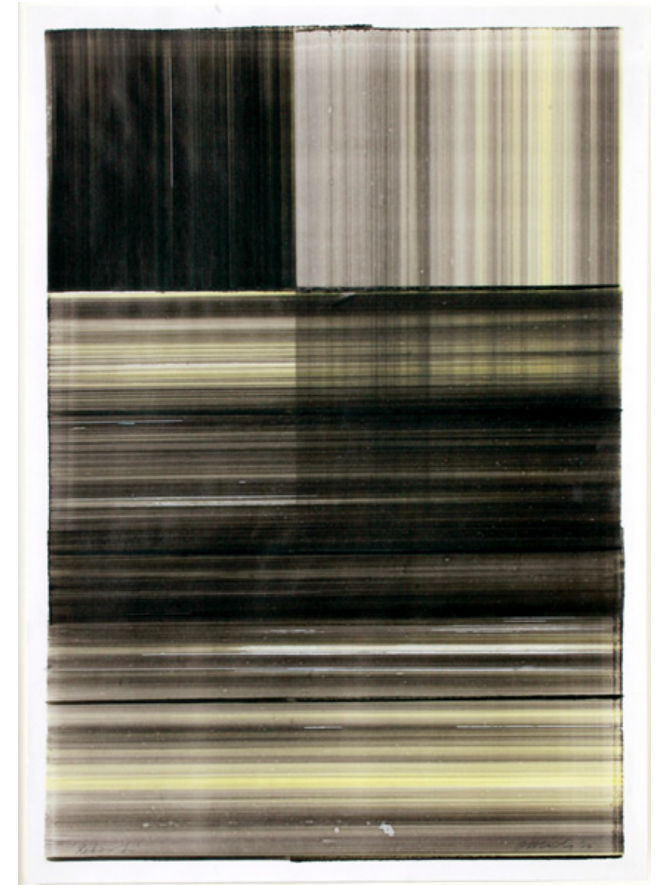

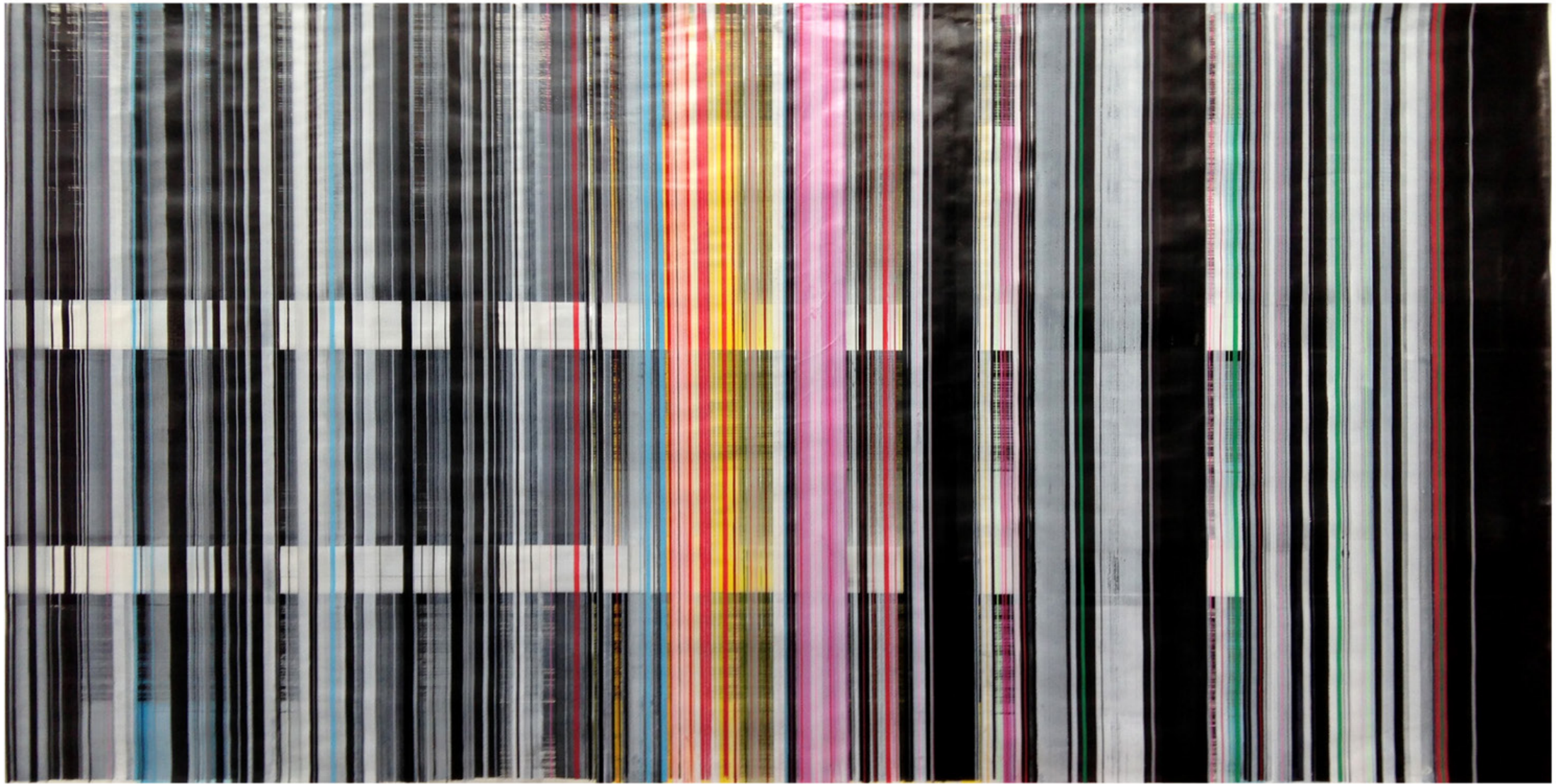

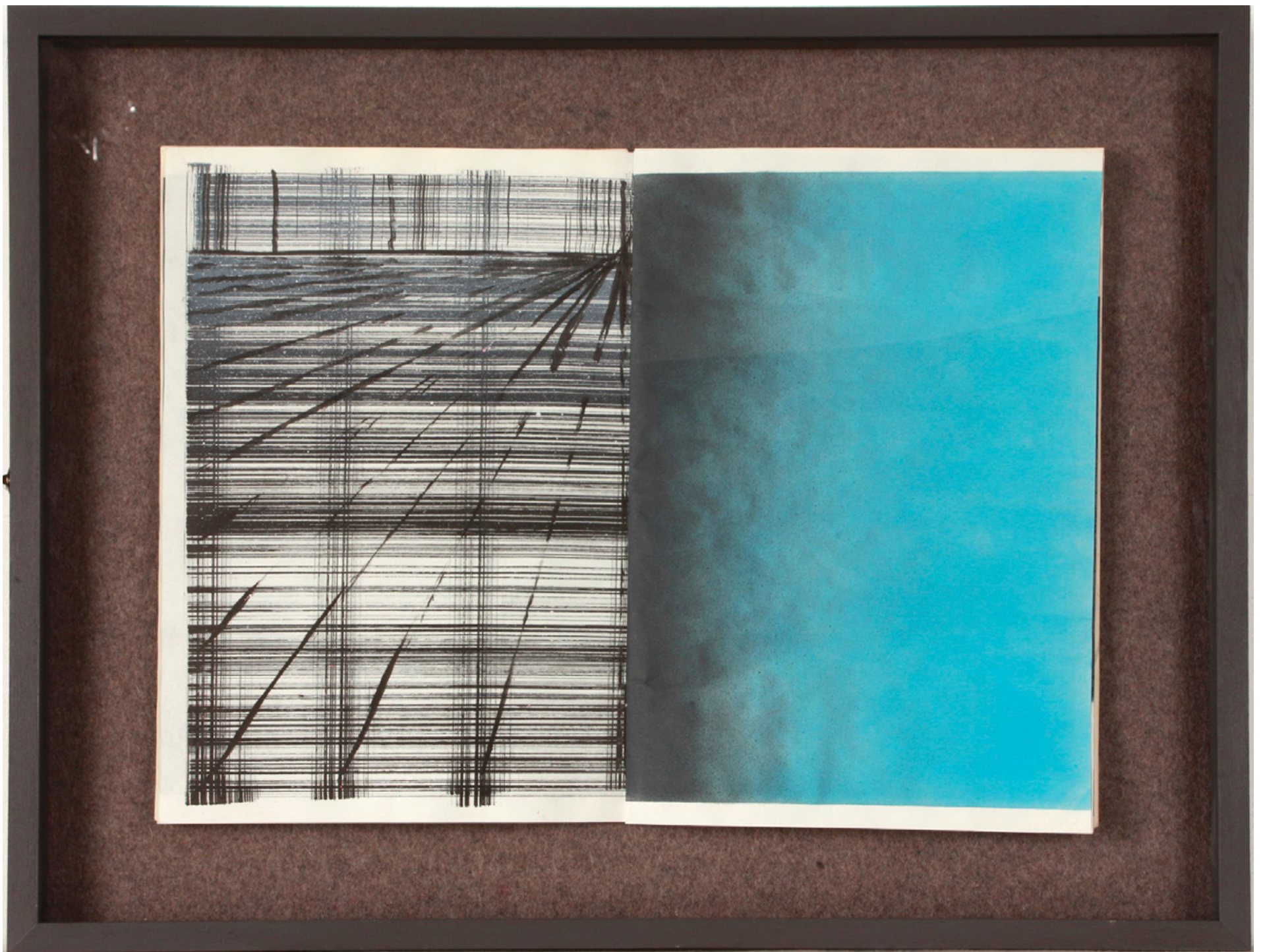

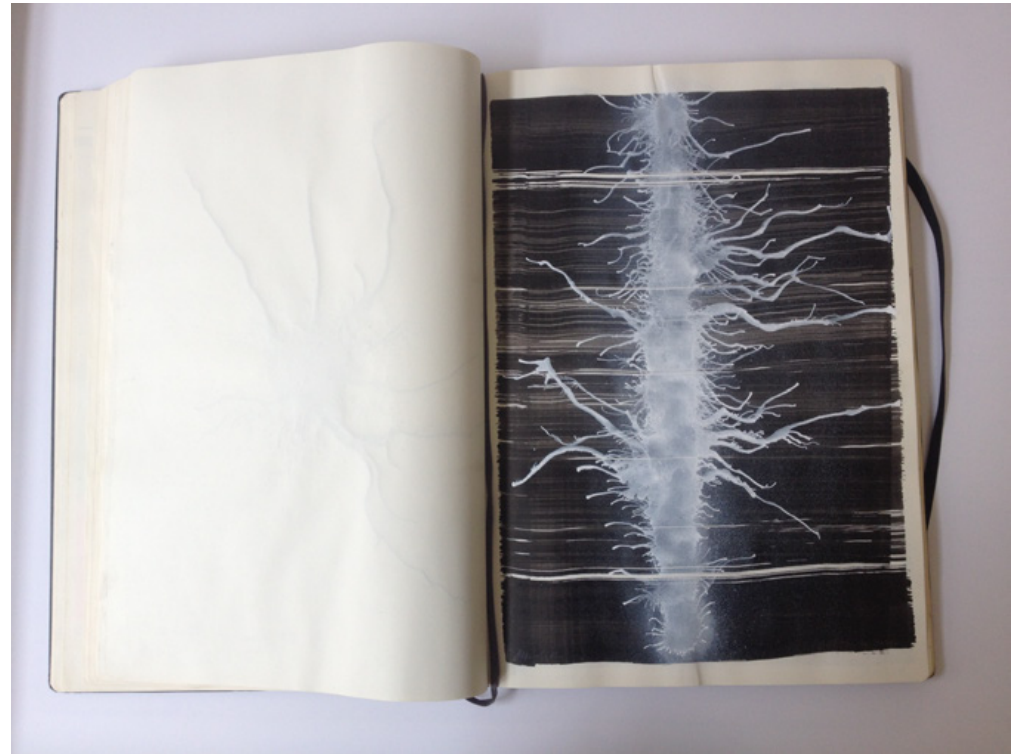
